- Expanding Our World: KDE Beyond The Linux Desktop
 - KDE technologies have become increasingly available on mobile devices such as netbooks and mobile phones. This brings new challenges to the development of the KDE applications as well as new opportunities to greatly increase the visibility of the KDE community.
 - For this topic we encourage talks addressing the challenges of porting the KDE platform and applications to different operating systems and mobile devices, such as mobile phones and netbooks.
- Connecting Our World: Social Desktop
 - Social desktop technology is allowing users of KDE applications to connect with each other and to have stronger links with the developer community. This technology brings a new and unique element to the KDE user experience.
